Flu Notification

The California Department of Public Health is urging all Californians six months of age and older to <u>get vaccinated against the flu</u> now, even if they have already gotten a COVID-19 vaccine. A bad case of the flu can be severe, and those with <u>certain health conditions</u> are at high risk of flu complications. The best way to prevent the flu is by getting vaccinated!

Sunnyvale School District will continue to prioritize student safety as we head toward the winter months. Our "Ruvna" health screening tool will continue to be active to support school health. In addition, all students and staff will receive a COVID-19 test kit to use before returning to school on January 9. Instructions on managing a "positive" result will be sent to all students and families with the tests. More information will come about when and where the test distribution will occur.

RUN HIDE DEFEND Drill on December 6 at 10:30 am

The lockdown drill will probably take about 30 minutes.

Here is what to expect during the drill:

1. The principal will announce that we will be doing a lockdown drill for an RHD scenario. The announcement will be simple-"We will now begin our lockdown drill. Please secure your classrooms."

2. Teachers prepare their rooms by ensuring doors are locked, lights are turned off, and blinds are closed.

3. Teachers keep their students quiet for the remainder of the drill (teachers will have an activity for students to do quietly during the drill)

4. DPS Officers will be coming around to pull on doors and try to open them. Then they will move to the next door/classroom/room.

5. If the door opens, the DPS officer will not engage with the teacher or students, and she will move to the next door/classroom/room.

6. We will plan on evacuating all buildings (as we usually do for any drill) depending on weather conditions. The principal will announce the "all clear" for the lockdown part of the drill and then announce whether or not we will evacuate.
