

Bookmark Design Contest


We had 27 students submit their designs for a national bookmark contest. We are eagerly waiting to hear if anyone from Cumberland won. Here are their creative submissions:



PROJECT CORNERSTONE



In April, a book that is new to the Project Cornerstone curriculum will be introduced to the TK & Kinder classes. The book is *Cuckoo* by Lois Ehlert. This is a Mexican Folktale filled with bold and beautiful art. The story teaches the values of **caring, integrity and responsibility** while modeling how to help others without being asked.



Grades 1-5 will read and discuss *The Empty Pot* by Demi, which tells the story of a schoolboy named Ping who is growing up in China long ago and accepts a challenge given by the emperor. A surprise twist at the end of the book shows **integrity** and **perseverance** by Ping which will lead to great discussions and activities led by the awesome Project Cornerstone classroom volunteers.

At home connections: TK & Kinder Discover, read and discuss traditional folktales from your own family heritage! Grades 1-5 Ask your student what C.H.I.R.P. stands for and which value they have committed to work on. (In case they forget = Courage, Honesty, Integrity, Responsibility, Perseverance).



3-5 STATE TESTING

CAASPP State-wide Testing Coming Soon!



Cumberland students in **grades 3-5** will take the **CAASPP** between **May 5th and May 23rd** (some tests may be after this window). The **California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP)** is the state's standardized testing system for students in **grades 3-8 and 11**. It measures how well students are mastering **California's academic standards** in **English Language Arts (ELA), Math, and Science**. CAASPP results provide valuable insight into student progress, giving teachers, families, and students a clearer picture of strengths and areas for growth.

Here's what to expect:

Math & ELA (Grades 3-8) – Smarter Balanced online tests

Science (Grades 5 & 8) – CAST or CAA for science

Special Education – Some students take the CAA instead of Smarter Balanced

Score reports will be available in the fall to help gauge student progress. Stay tuned for more details regarding specific testing dates.

HTST BUSING INFORMATION

Here are some important dates for SSD 2025-26 Home-to-School Transportation (HTST) registration process:

- April 4 Notification email with key registration dates.
- May 5-9 Notification email with qualifications
- **May 12-16** Priority registration opens for returning riders.
- May 26-30 General registration opens for new riders and families.
- July 14-18 Finalized routes and stops released to families.

SSD Implements Cost-Savings Measures to Ensure Long-Term Financial Stability

In a message sent to all Sunnyvale School District families on March 28, Superintendent Dr. Michael Gallagher shared that the district is taking proactive steps to address a structural budget deficit caused by rising costs, slower revenue growth, and the expiration of temporary pandemic relief funding. While planned reductions aim to minimize disruptions to students and staff, the district remains committed to its Strategic Plan and the Sunnyvale Promise. Families can expect ongoing updates as planning continues for the 2025–26 and 2026–27 school years.
