# SSD IMMIGRATION POLICIES and PROCEDURES

### LGBTQIA+ RIGHTS

We are dedicated to protecting the well-being of all members of our community, including the following policies and practices:

- We do not collect or maintain information about students' or families' immigration status.
- We will not allow immigration-enforcement officers on our campuses without proper identification and authorization.
- We protect student confidentiality and personal information. We will not share personal information about students or families with immigration enforcement.
- We do not allow immigration officers to contact students unless they present a signed judicial warrant or demonstrate extremely rare, urgent circumstances.

## Our practices are based on our core values and are reinforced by long-standing laws:

- Federal law states that all children in the United States, regardless of immigration or citizenship status, have the right to a free and appropriate public education.
- California law affirms that every student in the state has the right to attend public school free from discrimination, harassment, violence, intimidation, and bullying.

Providing an inclusive and nurturing environment in which students feel safe and know they belong is one of our key goals for student success. ## ELECTRONIC DEVICES/CELL PHONES

Per the Sunnyvale School District Family Handbook (<a href="https://www.sesd.org/Page/4575">https://www.sesd.org/Page/4575</a>), students are permitted to possess cell phones on campus, however, devices(s) must be turned off during the school day and not be visible. The District does not assume responsibility for lost or stolen items.



At Cumberland, in order to ensure a safe learning environment, students must adhere to the following rules regarding cell phone use:

- Cell phones must be turned off and cannot be visible on campus during the school day
- The school day includes, but is not limited to, class time, recess/lunch periods, during emergency drills, and field trips.
- Placing a cell phone on vibrate or texting is not considered off and is prohibited.
- Using a cell phone to audio or video record is prohibited.
- This applies to cell phones and all other personal electronic devices (smart watches, personal computers, tablets, iPods, portable speakers, audio or video players, etc.)



If caregivers need to contact a student during the school day, they are to contact the school office for assistance. If students need to use a phone during the school day, they must use a school phone, which is available to students with appropriate permission.

We utilize restorative practices and progressive discipline to support student behavior. Disciplinary action may include, but is not limited to, confiscation, parent contact and suspension. [EC 48901.5, 48901.7; ne]

NOTE: Students **can** wear their smart watches, but must have them in "School Mode," for example.

There are many variations of smartwatches that we do not "police" every watch. The spirit of the policy is to limit/remove disruption to the learning environment and maintain safe environments with regards to privacy, so if/when a smartwatch is being used inappropriately at school, the school would respond with restorative practices and move to progressive discipline as warranted.

#### **COOL COUGARS**




